

DECLARED AREAS

OFF LEAD EXERCISE AREAS:

The following areas are provided for dogs to be exercised off the lead. Whilst in these areas the dogs must still be under the effective control of the owner at all times. Droppings must be immediately collected and disposed of in the special bins (where provided), through the household garbage system or at the waste disposal site at Barretta.

Blackmans Bay

- Flowerpot Point Reserve
- Soldiers Rocks Reserve
- Tinderbox Hills Reserve
- Wastewater Treatment Plant (southern paddock area only)

Bruny Island

- All beaches and public foreshore (outside Reserved Lands under the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1970).

Coningham

- Clarkes Beach

Howden

- Foreshore (between Boat Ramp and Brightwater Road junction with Howden Road)

Huntingfield

- Peter Murrell Conservation Area (Perimeter fire breaks only)

Kingston/Kingston Beach

- Kingborough Sports Complex (between Summerleas Road, the main Stadium and the Croquet Club)
- Maranoa Heights Reserve (south of Kingston Fire Station)

- Tyndall Beach:
 - Year round (north and east of the mouth of Browns River - not in the picnic areas, the car-park area or in the vicinity of the sea scout building)
 - Additionally - from May 1st to October 31st (inclusive) on both sides of Browns River east of the footbridge but no further south than a line east from the corner of Osborne Esplanade (not in the picnic areas, the car-park area or in the vicinity of the sea scout building).
 - Alum Cliffs Track (from Tyndall Beach to Taronga Road)

Margate

- Dru Point Bicentennial Park (fenced area around treatment plant ponds)

Taroona/Taronga

- Cartwright Point Reserve (in Hobart City Council area but available to Kingborough dog owners)
- Taroona Park Reserve (between rear of Community Hall in Batchelor Way and Tennis Club)

Tinderbox

- Piersons Point Reserve

RESTRICTED AREAS:

The following areas are to be declared out of bounds to dogs at all times to avoid conflict with human users:

- All Council Reserves, halls, indoor sports buildings, sports grounds, clubrooms, churches and cemeteries without the specific authority of the property owner or in the case of Council properties, the written approval of the General Manager.
- All beaches and foreshore areas other than those detailed above.

The following areas are set aside principally for native flora and fauna conservation however, exercising of dogs, on the lead, on the formed and designated pathways and tracks is permissible at all times:

- at the Boronia Hill Reserves (Kingston to Blackmans Bay)
- at the Peter Murrell State Nature Reserve (Huntingfield to Howden and to Blackmans Bay), and
- on the connecting trail between the Mathinna Road and Balleny Drive Reserves at Oyster Cove.

TRAINING AREAS:

The following areas are provided as designated dog training areas:

- a) Country Dog Association Inc., Lower Longley Recreation Ground, Hovingtons Road Lower Longley, and
- b) Southern Obedience Club Inc., Gormley Drive, Kingston (part of Kingborough Sports Complex).

PROHIBITED AREAS:

The following areas (except for some specific Restricted Areas) are declared as areas prohibited to dogs as they provide sensitive habitats for wildlife:

- a) All State Reserves and the South Bruny National park (excluding the prescribed paths, etc in the Peter Murrell Reserve);
- b) Yellow Point Reserve, Birches Bay;
- c) Dripstone Point Reserve, Flowerpot;
- d) Boronia Beach within the fenced reserve area; and
- d) the section of the Pipeline Track between the intersection of the walking track and Wellington Park Boundary and Snake Plains Track.
