We are very proud of how easy-going she is and how we can enjoy socialising at our friends houses and bring her with us.

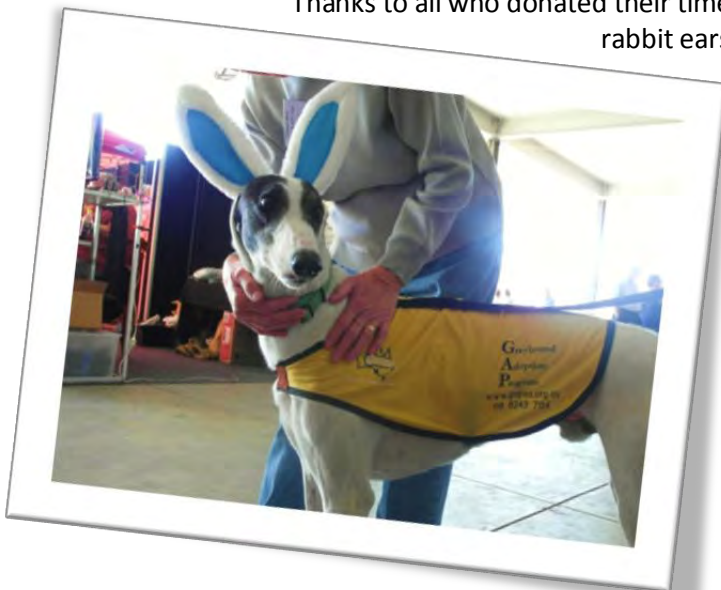
...perhaps our friends are actually more interested in Juno's company than ours??!

Foster Carers – Can you help?

Ever thought about becoming a Greyhound Foster Carer? Gap is seeking some new fosterers to join the fold.

Fosterers are an incredibly important part of the Adoption process and it is a very rewarding thing to do.

What does it involve?

Once a dog has been accepted into the Adoption Program, you take them home to begin their new lives. Your role is to give the dogs' time and assistance to help them adjust from their racing or kennel life into being a beloved family pet. They may not know what a washing machine is. They may never have encountered a glass sliding door. They don't know that we prefer them to sleep on their mat and not the new sofa. As their fosterer, you teach them these things. You help instil basic obedience, basic house training and manners. You help them adjust to their new and strange environment. Kennels don't usually have children running around, tempting rubbish bins or food left on benches, or toys that aren't meant for chewing. Kennels aren't usually as big as our houses – it can be a bit confusing! During this time you will begin to see their personalities emerge and this helps us find the right family for them. Some dogs will be happier in a busier house; some might prefer company or that of other dogs. Some dogs might prefer to be alone or perhaps only around older children. There will be some appointments the dogs need to keep – Angela will organise these for you. The dogs receive vet care, and will require micro-chipping, vaccinating, desexing, etc, to get them ready for adoption. The big aim of the fostering process is to get the dog their Green Collar and then a new home.

What is Provided?

- A dog!
- Dry dog food
- Training nights with other Fosterers
- Muzzles, leads
- Constant support from the Team



Things to Consider

- We ask that you have a secure and fenced yard to keep the dogs safe. Although not great jumping dogs, a high fence and secure gate is definitely best ☺
- Think about your time constraints. If your lifestyle was like mine years ago, you barely had more than 10 minutes at home in a week...
- Greyhounds must be walked on a lead at all times in public areas - this is particularly important for dogs learning to socialise and find out about the big wide world. Walking is a great way to bond with your dog and help to teach manners.
- Greyhounds earn the right to not wear a muzzle once they have passed their Green Collar Test and their *new owner* has applied to the Cat and Dog Management Board. As a fosterer, you will help get the dog ready for this wonderful muzzle-free life. This does mean that you will have the dog wearing a muzzle during their stay with you, which may be up to 8 weeks. This is incredibly important and must be complied with. SA is blessed to have a muzzle exemption process and we need to do whatever we can to keep it.
- Most dogs take about 4 – 6 weeks of your time. The hardest thing is saying goodbye – but you know that they won't forget you and will greet you warmly at the next function.

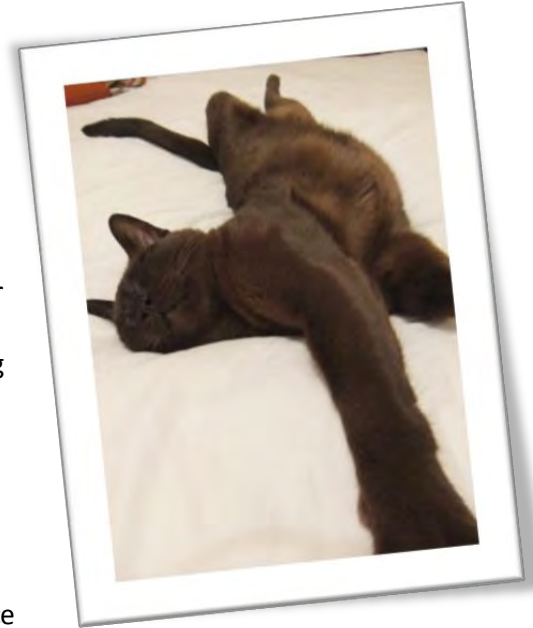

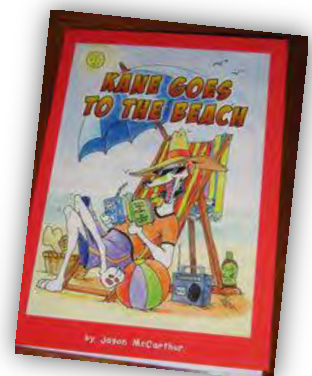


2011 Calendar

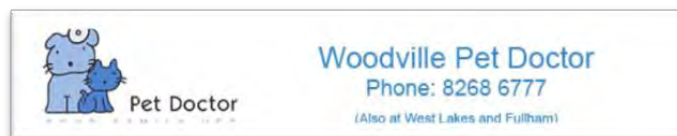
